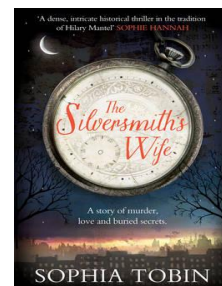

BOOK REVIEW by John Alderson**The Silversmith's Wife.** A novel by Sophia Tobin

This is a first novel by Sophia Tobin who worked for six years in a Bond Street antique dealer, specialising in silver and jewellery and is currently the Library Secretary of the Worshipful Company of Goldsmiths in London.

Sophia Tobin has used her knowledge and experience of working with silver to greatly enhance the colour and detail of this rather dark and psychological historical thriller set in the Bond Street area of London in the late 18th. Century.

Pierre Renard, a Frenchman aspiring to be a Gentleman, and the Silversmith of the title, is found with his throat cut by the night watchman, who, as there are no police at this time and no effort is therefore formally made to find the killer, becomes involved in the search himself. Mary Renard, the widow of the Silversmith, becomes the main character as she struggles to come to terms with the effect of her husband's death on her own life, as the marriage was clearly not a happy one, and that of her family and household.

Also central to the story are Chichesters, wealthy clients of Renard whose house is located quite close to where Renard was found murdered, and we have to wonder why Renard was there at that hour, but as we find more about the relationships between the two households and the problems surrounding the ability to keep the Silversmith business going, the author provides us with some well drawn characters and an insight into the interesting social relationships, prevalent at the time.

An interesting twist is the introduction of Renard's diary notes throughout the book, taking the reader the workings of his mind, his character and social ambitions. It is also through this diary that the identity of the killer is revealed at the very end of the book.

An excellent first novel with a very detailed insight into life in 18th. Century London.

Easter Holiday Ideas

The children will be home from school for two weeks and if you are unable to get away on holiday, you might be thinking of where you can take them for a day out that is not too far away from home.

Here are some tried and tested places by water.

Draycote Water Country Park: This very large reservoir on the other side of Coventry, just past Dunchurch, is a lovely place – whether you cycle around or take a picnic, or participate in some water sports. It has a good restaurant with a balcony overlooking the water, a little gift shop, a large children's play area. Chill out and watch the sailing, take photos of the sunsets, or just go for a walk by the water – normal parking is £2.50 for the day – but on busy days, parking can be free! Please note: Dogs are allowed in the Country Park area, but not around the Reservoir. Good toilet facilities in the Country Park and under the restaurant. Disabled access by lift to restaurant. You might like to have a walk around Dunchurch village too.

Kingsbury Water Park: Just past Coleshill. Lots to do, or you can just sit by the water and watch all the water events. Many lakes, all with different activities, from model boats to sailing, fishing and pedaloos. Enormous children's play area, train rides, children's activities, walks, restaurant, toilet facilities. Bike hire. Dogs allowed on leads. £3.50 per car. Pedestrians free. Disabled access.

Chasewater Country Park: Nr. Brownhills/Burntwood. Whether you want to practice water sports in a safe environment, take a picnic, play crazy golf or pedal go carts, canoeing, swings, slides - you will not be short of something to do here. Large cafe with art area, another cafe and a restaurant by Chasewater Railway station, where you can have a train ride on full size trains, antique shop, gifts, model railway, boating. Bird watching. Toilet facilities and disabled access. Free parking.
