We understand that some of you are confused by the two groups, The Residents Association and the Village Hall Committee.

Your Residents Association Committee is a group of volunteers who look after the village, covering such issues as planning applications; we also work with the Council on environment issues such as repairs to street lighting, fencing, clearing of pathways, the canal and the ford etc., attend airport meetings to discuss flight paths, runways and other issues that might impact on the village. We campaign when necessary, and undertake green belt monitoring. We work with Hampton in Arden Parish Council to jointly make the Common a good place to visit, by clearing hedgerows, making paths and installing seating (this year we hope). We also try and hold occasional “free to members” social events, that are non-profit making (see Catney Day).

We produce the Catney News nearly every month of the year, to enable better communication between villagers and to bring us all together.

The Village Hall Group (also volunteers) comes under the umbrella of the Residents Association at the moment and is a group that formed purely to protect, repair and maintain our Village Hall, which is moving from St. Alphege Trustees to Village Trustees following our campaign to protect it from being sold. The Village Hall Group will hold fund raising events, with any profits going towards the Village Hall Fund. This needs to have a considerable amount in it, in order to get very necessary repairs done and improvements carried out. HISTORY CORNER

There are quite a few very interesting items about Catney for view at Warwickshire County Archive office in Warwick. I hope to go and view them soon and take photos and notes, so that we can share them in the Catney News.

For example, it would seem that Catney celebrated Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee in 1897 in style. There are three lists available, one relates to the gifts Joseph Gillott gave to his tenants and their employees, another of subscribers to the memorial fund, and another listing gifts to the church. Joseph Gillott had a special commemorative casket box with a key, made at the Victoria Works, Graham Street, to hold the Jubilee papers.

Also, they have three scrapbooks put together by an headmaster of Catney School, covering the period 1958-1974, which should provide some interesting information.

Any memories, history or old photos of Catney you may have and would like to share with us, would be most welcome.

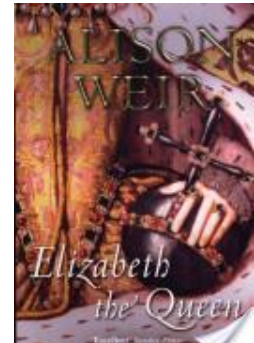

BOOK REVIEW by John N. Alderson

Elizabeth the Queen

Alison Weir specialises in writing books about the British Royals of the 16th. and 17th. Centuries and this account of Queen Elizabeth the First perhaps tells us more about the Queen as a woman than those of the many other books written on this subject.

She lived in a very patriarchal age and for a woman to find herself in that role is really quite extraordinary, and much of her reign appears to have been spent in justifying herself and her position to the Court and to her advisors who were all men. She comes across as vulnerable but very tough, considerate, but very demanding and even cruel when she thinks the occasion demands it.

The book details her relationship with Robert Dudley, later to be made Earl of Warwick, and one is left in little doubt as to the passion of their affair, and rumours of consummation and possibly a child abound within the incredibly closed society of the Royal Court, but Elizabeth maintains her status as the Virgin Queen until her death in 1603.

The question of the Succession is all important to her and her advisers as the long term stability of the Nation clearly depends upon it, but her procrastination and dallying with foreign suitors makes fascinating reading.

Elizabeth clearly feels it is her right to rule and is very concerned that “her people” should love her, but also accepts the responsibility that her decisions should be for the benefit of England and its people. She must have been an extremely difficult person to deal with on a daily basis and she was fortunate in having someone like William Cecil, Lord Burghley as her principal advisor.

This appears to be a well researched and descriptive book about a relatively calm period of English history but a Court that spent more time hunting, feasting and dancing that might seem appropriate with such affairs
