Dear Residents,

Spring is here and it is subscription time again. For the first time in many years, the Residents Association Committee has had to make the decision which was accepted by vote at the AGM, to increase subscriptions to £3 for individuals, £5 for a couple or £10 for a family of 4 or more. This is to assist with the costs of printing the Catney News, including the purchase of paper, the necessary insurance required for a Residents Association Committee, a small fund we need to have to fight things that may be detrimental to the village and the occasional purchase of food and drink for functions that are free to members. Our only revenue now is the subscriptions we receive. All profit from functions put on by the Village Hall Committee will always go to the Village Hall fund and not to us.

So please support your Residents Association. Your yearly subscription is basically the same price as having a cup of coffee in a cafe and it would be so good to have you with us. Please see on the next page some of the things the Committee has worked on over the last year.

On the back page of this copy of the News, you will find a form to complete, just tear it off if you receive the Catney News in hard copy or print it out if you receive it by email, pop it in an envelope and put it through one of the doors of the addresses listed or to the Spar shop with your subscription. We will be providing membership cards this year and these will be delivered to you once we have all the subscriptions in.

Please note: Last year, we managed simply because some of you very kindly gave an extra donation when paying your subscriptions. This generosity is a wonderful help and very much appreciated. Thank you.

During the last year, Catney Residents Association Committee has worked on:

The Environment – getting footpaths cleared, fences mended, the Common cleared of overgrowth and planted, street lights switched back on, parking issues outside the shops and down Lugtrout Lane, hedges cut back, regular meeting with the Council, safety issues, attending regular meetings at the airport (10 meetings last year).

Significant Planning Issues - looking at new requests, inappropriate buildings, changes of use, green belt issues, proposed new builds. Meetings with builders, ensuring affordable housing is included in any proposals for new housing.

Catney News: Production of monthly newsletter to aid communication between villagers.

Village Hall: Introduction of new Village Hall Committee, operating under the banner of the Residents Committee, to facilitate the transfer to the village Trustees of the Village Hall from the Trustees at St. Alphege, and to raise funds through social events to ensure the necessary repairs and maintenance of the Hall is continuous.

Non-fund-raising events: In 2012: A village barbeque – free to Residents Association members and Carol Singing around the Village Christmas Tree. In 2013 – it is hoped that there will be more events purely for villagers to socialise and have fun together in addition to the necessary fund raising events that will be organised by the Village Hall Committee.

Our AGM was held in March and 35 villagers attended. We had hoped that more of you would come along, to what was an interesting and interactive meeting, as this was an excellent chance to not only show your support for the work of the Residents Association, but to have input and to learn what the Residents Association has been doing over the last year on your behalf. A very big thank you to all who did come along, and especially to those who volunteered to join our Committee and to those who were interested in becoming Trustees for the Village Hall. To anyone who did not attend, but would be interested in either joining the Committee or becoming a Trustee, please contact one of the current Committee members as we would love to hear from you. It was explained that continued support would be required if we were to go ahead and take on the Village Hall as a Village responsibility. The villagers who attended voted for us to go ahead and take the building over from St. Alphege Trustees – this means we have to raise money for repairs, on-going maintenance, heating, lighting, and all the other expenses that are part of running a building of local interest; if we do not look after the Hall, then we will lose it back to St. Alphege who will probably sell it, so all the events held there currently would stop and we could lose the gift given to the Village by Joseph Gillot when he built his school and chapel. Therefore we please ask that you support the events we hold at the Hall, help us to get the funds we need, and offer your help wherever possible. If you would be interested in giving a regular donation, or a one off donation, again we would love to hear from you.

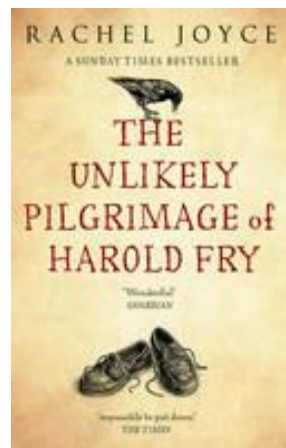

THE UNLIKELY PILGRIMAGE OF HAROLD FRY

Book Review: By Chris Cluley

Harold is just an ordinary recently retired pensioner, living with his wife in a relationship grown cold, when he receives a letter from a work colleague from his past to say she is dying. As a result, one day, he goes to post a letter and keeps walking. A spur of the moment decision sees Harold walking on past the post box and 600 miles across the country in just the clothes he is wearing – unsuitable shoes and with his mobile phone still in the house he has just left. We know he is going to see the old friend, in a hospice, hundreds of miles away, but why can't he just catch a train? The story of Harold Fry's life unfolds as he walks; we begin to try and understand the difficulties in his marriage; the problems with his son; and why he feels his friend will not die until he gets there, as long as he keeps walking. He has little adventures on the way and experiences things he has never before encountered; he attracts media coverage and hangers on. Will he make this incredible journey and if so, will his friend still be alive? This is a gentle story, which shows the resilience of the human spirit and the quirks of life which lead us to do things we never expected we would and the things in life we should have done and maybe still could before it's too late.
