Emerging Solihull Local Plan Review

SMBC have now received a response from the Planning Inspectors which is likely to trigger a pause of the Local Plan examination pending the publication of the revised National Planning Policy Framework(NPPF) document in the Spring. Hampton In Arden Parish Neighbourhood Plan Review

The Neighbourhood Plan consultation process ended on the 22 nd March (2 days following the writing this item). Whilst the responses to date have not been analysed we understand the response level was disappointing – more information next month

Airport News

An RA representative attended the ACC meeting earlier this month . Among the items discussed was the soon to be published draft Noise Action Plan which will be published for consultation shortly and plans were being drawn up for a working group to be formed made of a interested ACC members including those from local community organisations, to discuss and come up with the Night Time Noise Plan for the years 2024/7. We will be represented.

The passenger predictions for 2023/24 are better than pre covid figures despite the cost of living crisis.

Significant expenditure including solar panels, new roofs in some areas, new stands and a new security area complete with sensitive full body scanners to meet the new Govt requirements. The 100ml liquid limit is also disappearing in this country although still in existence in some countries. The Airport have a dynamic Net Zero / Carbon Reduction policy details of which are on their website.

At the AGM on the 3rd March several concerned residents raised concerns with Saqib Bhatti MBE.MP over the potential summer noise nuisance they have been experiencing over the years emanating from NB events being held in the triple tepee. (Newlands Bishop Farm Planning application 2020/02784 for the erection of a triple tepee) The application itself was withdrawn in Sept.22. As a result of this discussion, the residents met with representatives of the RA and CdeB Ward Councillor Giles Cook on the 3rd March with a view to see what can be done.

Village Hall News

Hope you all agree the new tarmac drive looks fantastic. We apologise to the local residents living across from the hall for any inconvenience caused during the construction which thankfully was done quickly.

The Trustees are pleased to announce that a 5 camera CCTV system will be installed during April providing reassuring security protection for the hall and play area.

AGM 2023

The AGM was well attended with over 40 people in the audience. Saqib Bhatti MP gave a short introduction to his priorities and challenges. He is a firm supporter of the green belt, approves of the net zero target, and is part of a pressure group trying to revise planning laws to reduce the influence of the planning inspectorate and give more power to local authorities and local plans. Questions from the floor were mainly concerning local planning applications. Sagib pointed out that an MP has no power over local authority planning departments but he has and will support local campaigns, which he advised to be the best way forward. He was part of a successful campaign to re-open the minor injuries unit in Solihull The business part of the AGM followed, with reports from the RA Chairman (Dave Cuthbert), Treasurer (Annette Scott) and Social Secretary (Lesley Cuthbert). Hall trustee Steve Wallis, updated us with news on the Village Hall. Steve gave a special thank you and a gift to Gareth Thomas, a trustee and our Hall Manager for the past 9 years, who is moving away.

BOOK REVIEW by John Alderson.

Clare Mackintosh Ar midright, one of them is dead. THE AST PARTY PAR

THE LAST PARTY A Novel by Clare Mackintosh

I understand this book is to be the first of a series featuring DC Ffion Morgan, which although I wasn't aware of this when I read the book, that may be good news, as DC Morgan is a very interesting character to be further developed.

The Last Party takes place on New Year's Eve hosted by Rhys Lloyd, a failing opera star from the village of Cwm Coed a tiny village on the edge of Llyn Drych, a small lake through which runs the boundary between Wales and England.

The Party is to celebrate the opening of a very contentious modern group of holiday homes built on the opposite side of the lake to the village, and which Rhys Lloyd has been instrumental in helping to develop and employed a local builder for the construction.

Rhys is found dead and the police are brought in, represented by DC Ffion Morgan who was born and bred in the village and DC Leon Brady of the English side where the body is found.

The plot takes time to develop as there are quite a lot of characters and therefore suspects in a very small space, but Christie like, Mackintosh works through it well for a satisfactory conclusion.

There are a number of interesting issues explored in this story; the relationship between the two detectives and their respective bosses, Welsh village life, the attitude of wealthy visitors and not least the setting in a beautiful wooded lakeland valley with a mountainous peak at its head.

There is a lot about normal life in this book which I found quite enjoyable.

Mini Eggs cookies add a fun Easter twist to these delicious chocolate chip cookies. A great, easy recipe for getting kids busy in the kitchen this Easter.

INGREDIENTS

- 100 g (1/4 cup) butter softened
- 150 g (¾ cup) brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 200 g (1 1/4 cup) self-raising flour
- 50 g (1/4 cup) chocolate chips
- 2x 90g packets of mini or micro eggs



METHOD

Preheat your oven to 180C / 170C Fan / 325F and grease or line 3 baking trays.

Mix the butter and sugar together

Weigh the butter and sugar and add them to a large mixing bowl or freestanding mixer.

1. Beat the butter and sugar together using the paddle attachment of your mixer or a handheld mixer until they are light and fluffy.

Add the egg and vanilla extract

1. Add the egg and vanilla to your bowl and mix until it is well combined.

Add the flour and mini eggs

- 1. Add the flour and mix it well together.
- 2. Bash half the mini egg to break them up and make them a little smaller. Add the broken mini eggs and chocolate chips and mix them in with a wooden spoon.

Bake the Easter cookies

- 1. Spoon large dollops of cookie mix onto your prepared baking trays. Leave space between them as they'll spread in the oven.
- 2. Put a few mini eggs on top of each cookie before they go in the oven.
- 3. Bake in the oven for 8-10 minutes. They're ready when they have flattened down a little and started to turn a little golden.

Remove the cookies from your oven. Leave to cool on the baking tray for a few minutes then move them on to a wire rack to cool completely
