Planning Update

Battery Storage Facility Proposals

Arlington (the potential developers) held a 2 evening event in the village hall last month allowing local residents to view the proposals and comment. Since that event, members of both the Parish Council and the Residents Association have met with Arlington to discuss their plans in more detail, No planning application has been lodged with SMBC yet but one is likely early March. As soon as possible after the full application has been lodged, the RA will organise an open meeting in the Village Hall; hopefully our Ward councillors will be available to attend and the proposal can be discussed and any actions agreed. We did undertake a straw email poll after the events in the hall – over 80% of the respondents were against the proposals.

Emerging Solihull Local Plan Review

SMBC have now responded to the Planning Inspectors letter advising that, as a result of the current consultation concerning the Levelling Up Regeneration Bill and reforming of the planning system, circumstances had changed and they were seeking the Planning Inspectors comments as to the acceptability of the Plan as it stands. Should the Inspectors accept the argument then we could see the Plan being adopted by the Autumn. This is then likely to result in a surge of planning applications for development throughout the Borough including the sites at the end of Lugtrout Lane – 800 homes and Oak Farm 90 homes or a care home.

Childrens Play Area





BOOK REVIEW by John Alderson.

ONE AUGUST NIGHT A Novel by Victoria Hislop



This book is written as a sequel to Hislop's first novel "The Island" with a cure for leprosy having been discovered and the lepers returning as Spinalonga Island is closed. Maria returns with her new husband Nikos, a doctor from the island who helped save her life, to Plaka where the early action takes place.

Maria's sister Anna who has married Andreas the son of the very wealthy Vandoulakis family has given birth to her first child, a daughter Sofia. Anna has however entered into a relationship with Andreas's cousin Manolis, who was originally more or less engaged to Maria before she had to leave Plaka to go and stay on Spinalonga.

At a huge celebration to welcome the closing of the island Anna is shot dead, Manolis leaves for Crete and Andreas is arrested.

The story is what happens to who next.

As always with Hislop the story is beautifully told with well drawn characters with lots of colour; however, I didn't find the ending too satisfying, but possibly I am being too critical of a very fine writer.

Every cold and dark phase ends and hence begins a beautiful phase of warmth and vibrance. Don't believe? Just notice March.
