






BOOK REVIEW

THE DARK A crime novel by Emma Haughton

This is the first time I have come across Emma Haughton and although she has written a number of books, this, I understand, is her first crime novel.

Kate North is an A+E doctor in Bristol who suffers a very serious car accident leaving her with mental as well as physical issues to overcome and towards the end of her rehabilitation accepts a position as a temporary replacement doctor at UNA, a United Nations Research station in Antarctica.

We are very soon introduced into life in a very small insular community virtually cut off from the outside world in very harsh weather conditions and virtual darkness for the next six months. The previous doctor, Jean-Luc, appears to have died, out on the ice in slightly unusual circumstances, which no one wishes to talk about and which adds to the tension that seems to exist between group members and is not helped by her own drug dependent problems of recovery in an alien environment.

Her suspicions are raised when she finds her clinic broken into and followed by the apparent suicide of another member. We are introduced to the small diverse international group that make up members of the station, their nationalities, personalities, and secrets they all have, as a pregnancy and two more deaths possibly indicate a killer amongst them.

This is real pressure stuff in terms of a story in a confined space and within an environment with which we are totally unfamiliar. I enjoyed reading this book, particularly as (rather smugly) I correctly identified the villain fairly early on, but with Haughton's such beautifully drawn characters, I suggest this to be excellent reading for a cold day in the warmth of your own home.
