Remembrance Sunday 9th November

On Sunday 9th November our Village Hall will revert to being a Church for a Remembrance Service, remembering all those who bravely fought in war and those who sadly lost their lives fighting. We especially remember the brave souls from our village who lost their lives during WW1 and WW2.

We hope you will be able to join us for this very special service, assembling in the hall at 10.40 a.m. for the start of the service at 10.45 a.m. Complimentary refreshments will be served following the service.

Our Village memorial is very unusual, it is our Bapstismal Font. The names of those from our Village who perished in WW1 are engraved around the bowl of the Font and the names of those from the Village who perished during WW2 are engraved on the lid, with one more name engraved on a jug that sits at the base of the Font. As a sign of respect, during the service we will be invited to place poppies around the font.

Planning News

Grey Belt – Planning Applications

We are seeing an increasing number of planning applications across the Parish. There are 2 main reasons for this 1) as a result of the Borough having no local planning in place to address the established housing need and not having a 5 year land supply to address that need, and 2) recent changes in the planning regulations, introduced the concept of 'Grey Belt' in greenbelt. This takes away the need to demonstrate very special circumstances needed to support inappropriate development in the greenbelt.

The result of this is that most of the greenbelt in the Borough can be classed as Grey Belt. These two factors clear the ground for developers to apply for sites which previously might have been off limits

PL 2025/00164/PPFL 26 Henwood Lane

We have been made aware that the applicant has appealed to the Planning Inspector for determination on the basis that SMBC have not done so within a reasonable timeframe

PL2024/00037/PPOL up to 50 homes off Lugtrout Lane

Following the approval of outline planning permission the site has now been put up for sale with potential developers requested to make offers by mid-November

PL2025/01715/DIS Oak Farm 2.5 storey homes canal side

Many thanks to all those residents that supports the Associations' decision to object to the revised design for homes facing the canal on the site. Although the applicant has been a little more creative in the design of the properties, we still consider the material used- red brick and tiles, and the height create an unacceptable visual impact at what is currently an open green aspect.

New Neighbourhood Plan

By the time members read this, the Parish Council will have lodged the draft new Plan with the Council. The next steps will be for them to evaluate it and organise a public consultation on it and this will give the opportunity to statutory stakeholders and local residents to comment on the plan.
